SAINTS OF THE WEEK:

12th October: St Wilfrid (c.634-709) His was a turbulent and controversial life. Educated by Celtic monks at Lindisfarne he became more and more influenced by the Roman form of Christianity prevalent at Canterbury. He travelled there to study it and then to Rome. On his return to England he was made Abbot of Ripon and introduced the Benedictine Rule there. He greatly influenced the Synod of Whitby (664) which rejected the Celtic form of Christianity in favour of the Roman one. He was then made Bishop of York. His tenure of office was not without controversy. Despite the many controversies he was involved in he was a dedicated missionary and instrumental in establishing the Roman form of Christianity and the Benedictine model of monasticism in all of England where they remained dominant until the Reformation of the 16th Century, nearly a thousand years later.
