SAINTS OF THE WEEK: 22nd October: Pope St John Paul (1920-2005) Born in Poland, he studied in Rome and was ordained priest after which he undertook various pastoral and academic posts in Poland eventually becoming Archbishop of Krakow. He took an active part in Vatican II and was elected Pope in 1978. His papacy was known for his firm position on issues of sexual morality and was not without controversy. He expended himself tirelessly on pastoral visits across the world and was particularly concerned with families, the young and the old and the sick. He was a champion of freedom in the face of state oppression and was influential in the fall of Soviet-style communism, although he was also critical of the abuses of capitalism.
