SAINTS OF THE WEEK: 12th January: St Aelred of Rievaulx (1109-67) The son of a Saxon Priest at Hexham, he was in early life a courtier in the household of King David of Scotland. He then became a Cistercian Monk at Rievaulx in 1147. He wrote his first important work at the invitation of St Bernard. His interest in psychology and his devotion to the suffering humanity of Christ led him to write especially about the nature of friendship for which he is most famous. He also wrote a life of Edward the Confessor.
