29th April: St Catherine of Siena (1347-1380) The daughter of a dyer in Siena she received visions from an early age and lived a life of great austerity at home. She then became a Dominican Tertiary and while continuing her contemplative prayer also devoted herself to the service of the sick and the poor as well as the reconciliation of sinners at which she was especially effective. At a time of great turbulence in the Church's history, she used her charisma to influence popes and other rulers both in person and by letter in order to bring peace to the Church.
