THE YEAR OF ST JOSEPH: Pope Francis declared the beginning of a Year of St. Joseph on the 8th December. This was the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX declaring St. Joseph, Patron of the whole Church. All parishes in the diocese have been asked to say the prayer to St Joseph on the 19th of each month.

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too,
show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,
and defend us from every evil. Amen.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK: 22nd July: St Mary Magdalene - Mary was one of the women who were close followers of Jesus. She is named in the Gospels at least twelve times – more than most of the apostles. She was one of the only three people to stay with Jesus right through the crucifixion and, according to John and Mark, she was the first person to encounter Jesus after his Resurrection. In June of this year Pope Francis elevated her commemoration to that of a Feast and called her an “apostle to the apostles”.

INVITATION TO PRAYER: Bishop Mark and the Bishops of England and Wales would like all people of faith to pray daily at 6pm, where they are, at this time, for an end to the pandemic. For Catholics, this is a traditional time to pray the Angelus. During times of great hardship or upheaval, in history, Our Lady has often appeared to her people carrying the rosary. This is how Bishop Mark hopes to mark that moment of 6pm each day, following the Angelus.

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY: Pope Francis has established a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, taking place for the first time on Sunday July 25th.
