COVID-19 EASING OF RESTRICTIONS: Thanks to everyone for their cooperation and help to date. As we enter a new phase, we are keen to continue to provide a safe environment for all people who gather for worship. Much remains the same but there will be some changes:

1. Please continue to sanitise your hands on entry and exit.
2. Whilst no longer mandatory, it is highly recommended, and we ask that you continue to wear a face covering whilst in Church.
3. Existing Track and Trace procedures will continue.
4. The Church will continue to be well ventilated.
5. General cleaning of high frequency touch points after each act of worship and thorough cleaning to continue.
6. Social distancing: Although no longer a requirement, if you would like to keep a safe space, please sit in the Lady Chapel or Sanctuary, or pick up a 'please leave a space' laminated card to put beside you if you choose to sit on a bench.
7. Communal Singing will be permitted, **when singing masks must be worn**. Hymn books will be available.
8. Communion will revert to the former practice of coming forward from the back in a single line, maintaining a safe distance.
9. At the end of Mass please exit using the front or side entrance. Please leave your hymn book on the table provided.
10. Collection plates will be available by the entry and exit doors.

SUNDAY REFLECTION: **You are the Christ.**

SAINTS OF THE WEEK: 16th September: St Cyprian (d.258) A Roman lawyer working in Carthage he was converted to Christianity c.246 and was made Bishop of that see by c.248. Up to that point Roman persecution of the Christians was sporadic and localised usually sparked off by some natural disaster for which the Christians were blamed. But at this point the Emperor Decius started a general persecution. Cyprian went into hiding from which he continued to lead his flock. Many hundreds of Christians were put to death and many gave up the faith. Eventually Cyprian himself was taken and executed for refusing to renounce his Christian beliefs, apart from his courage, Cyprian is celebrated for his writings and his pastoral care. Also **St Cornelius (d. 253)** Elected Pope in 251 he was forced to flee home from Decius' persecution. He was martyred while in exile near Rome.

THE YEAR OF ST JOSEPH: Pope Francis declared the beginning of a Year of St. Joseph on the 8th December. This was the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX declaring St. Joseph, Patron of the whole Church. All parishes in the diocese have been asked to say the prayer to St Joseph on the 19th of each month.

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too,
show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life.
