## Pope Francis' Message for World Day of the Poor

*For your sakes Christ became poor (cf. 2 Cor 8:9)*

This year's theme is a summons to responsibility and commitment as men and women who are part of our one human family. In this year's message, Pope Francis is calling us to action in the face of poverty and exclusion. The worst thing that can happen to a Christian community, he says, is to be "dazzled by the idol of wealth, which ends up chaining us to an ephemeral and bankrupt vision of life." As members of civil society, we are asked to uphold the values of freedom, responsibility, fraternity and solidarity, and as Christians, to make charity, faith and hope the basis of our lives and our actions. Pope Francis reminds us that "where the poor are concerned, it is not talk that matters; what matters is rolling up our sleeves and putting our faith into practice through a direct involvement, one that cannot be delegated".

**POPE'S INTENTIONS FOR NOVEMBER:** For children who suffer. We pray for children who are suffering, especially those who are homeless, orphans and victims of war; may they be guaranteed access to education and the opportunity to experience family affection. See also <https://thepopevideo.org/>

**SAINTS OF THE WEEK: St Albert the Great (1200-1280)** A Dominican friar, he was one of the most celebrated teachers and thinkers of his day. Thomas Aquinas was his pupil and owed him a great debt in the influence he had on his thought. Both men made extensive use of the new learning coming from rediscovered works of the great Greek philosopher Aristotle (384-322BC) and the scientific, mathematical and logical knowledge of the Muslim world. They insisted on the necessity for reason to be brought to bear on religious thinking, a principle still fundamental in Catholic teaching.

As we have so few envelopes in use now we have decided to stop the expense to the parish of getting the boxes. This will also make things easier for the volunteers counting and banking. If you still use an envelope and do not wish to move to standing order then the parish will still be able to get the same benefit from your donation if it is £30 or less if you put it loose into the basket (as currently there is a scheme which means we claim an extra 25% from HMRC on what is put in the basket). If you would still like the privacy an envelope affords you then please do just pop your donation in an ordinary blank envelope. If you would like to give more than £30 one week then please use one of the yellow One Off envelopes provided at the back of church and we will match your donation to your gift aid declaration.
