SAINTS OF THE WEEK: 25th May: St Bede (673-735) Educated at the Monastery of Wearmouth from the age of seven, he became a monk there. He never travelled far from his monastery, but became a great scholar of many interests including astronomy, the scriptures and history. Although most of his work was on the scriptures his greatest fame is as an historian and he is called the Father of English History because of the importance of his work on early Saxon history, still relevant today. It is said he invented the A.D. system of dating.

26th May: St Philip Neri (1515-1595) He started life in business. He then decided to give himself to God and took up the study of philosophy and theology. Eventually he sold his books and applied the money to works of charity. A charismatic preacher and leader, he attracted others to his work which led to the foundation of the Oratorian's. Although a man of austerity he was also known for his gentleness and sense of fun. Patron of humour and the U.S. Special Forces (!).

27th May: St Augustine of Canterbury (d.604/5) Prior of St Gregory's monastery of St Andrew's in Rome he was sent to carry the message of Christ to the wild and savage world of Anglo-Saxon England. He went with great reluctance and settled at Canterbury, becoming the first Archbishop of Canterbury.
